The ITAR can have a significant impact on a variety of transactions, including exports of commodities, transfers of technical data, and provision of services. Virtually any transaction subject to the ITAR controls requires an authorization from the State Department's Directorate of Defense Trade Controls ("DDTC"). Yet, determining whether a particular transaction is governed by the ITAR often is challenging. This is because the ITAR controls not only items traditionally thought of as "arms" but also products and technologies that might not be inherently military, such as commercial satellites and any item specifically designed, configured, adapted or modified for a military application. Ms. Ganzer will discuss DDTC's commodity jurisdiction process for determining the regulatory jurisdiction over defense articles, data and services, as well as related regulatory and policy developments.
